

## **The St George-in-the-East Partnership**

A proposal for the future life of the parish has emerged from the vacancy review process. As a result, we will have Tim Clapton and Angus Ritchie as our priests for at least the next 16 months. Tim, particularly, will be taking our Sunday services and offering pastoral support for the congregation and the parish.

At the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, the Churchwardens, on behalf of the Standing Committee and the PCC, formally announced the parish's agreement to the St-George-in-the-East Partnership. The Partnership has been proposed as the solution most likely to fulfill the vision for the parish articulated by the PCC during the review process by providing support to take our vision forward and people to help us do it.

The partners will be:

- the Parish, the Bishop of Stepney
- Angus Ritchie and Tim Clapton (the two C of E clergy currently employed by the Centre for Theology and Community (CTC), tenants in our Crypt)
- a lay resident community of up to 6 young people (to be resident in the Rectory, and to include a lay chaplain)
- CTC, as employers of Angus and Tim, will oversee the lay community and bring experience of parish development work in the East End.

Angus and Tim will begin their ministry at St George-in-the-East in May, with the lay community beginning in September. The partnership will initially run until September 2016, and it is hoped that this experimental phase will lead on to a longer-term partnership, building on and also learning from, the experience of the first 16 months. Angus Ritchie will be priest-in-charge; Tim Clapton will be assistant priest, with day-to-day pastoral responsibility for the parish. Their combined workload will represent 0.6 of a post. The members of the lay community will worship with the parish on a daily basis, and will each work half a week each on parish development work, concentrating on areas of mission in our parish, to be identified by the Partnership.

We will be launching the St George-in-the-East Partnership on

Wednesday 6th May at 7.30pm and hope to see you there.
